

Piedmont Diving and Rescue Association Rules and Regulations

All PDRA members are required to be familiar with and comply with all PDRA <u>By-Laws</u>, Rules and Regulations, <u>Instructor Requirements</u> (applies to Instructors), and the <u>Code of Ethics</u>.

- Any member who violates PDRA <u>By-Laws</u>, Rules and Regulations, <u>Instructor Requirements</u>, or <u>Code of Ethics</u> may face:
 - A fine for each violation
 - U Suspension of membership
 - Revocation of membership ➤ Final decisions are at the discretion of the PDRA Board of Directors
- Any rule violations must be reported promptly by the member, in addition to completing the <u>Violation Form</u>, and submit the form within 24 hours to <u>info@ncpdra.org</u>.

RR2. % Promptly report any accident or serious injury.

- Prompt reporting is mandatory: Any accident or serious injury occurring on PDRAowned property must complete the <u>Incident Report</u> and submit it to <u>info@ncpdra.org</u> within 24 hours.

- Any gear that has been in any **body of water within the last 5 days** where **aquatic nuisance species are known or suspected** must **NOT** be used in any PDRA quarry.
- Before using the gear in PDRA waters, you must:
 - o Complete the full gear cleaning protocol
 - o Ensure a minimum 5-day drying period for all equipment.

- All individuals in or on PDRA waters must wear one of the following:
 - ♣ A wetsuit of 3mm thickness or more.

 - An operable U.S. Coast Guard-approved flotation/safety device.
- A This rule applies to **all water activities**, including: *Wading, swimming, snorkeling, scuba diving, or using floats, rafts, tubes, canoes, paddleboards, etc.*

- No Solo Diving. Anyone entering PDRA waters with scuba gear must dive with a buddy.
- Dive buddies must use **comparable equipment**, ensuring both individuals are equally equipped to support each other in case of emergency.

RR6. Refer to By-Laws for full membership regulations.

- All Applicants must complete Membership Application in full.
- **Quantified divers** are eligible for membership. Students must wait until certification to apply. Applicants must upload a copy of their certification card.
- iii Family memberships only cover:
 - A legal spouse
 - Children under 18 ➤ Children 18 and older must apply for their own membership. This is due to fact that once a person reaches the age of majority (18), individuals gain full legal control over their actions and decisions.
- Incomplete applications including ineligible individuals will not be accepted or processed.
- Membership becomes active once processed by the Membership Chair and a card and key are issued and received. Note that cards and keys are mailed through the USPS and the PDRA has no control over delivery times.

RR7. E Members must carry their current PDRA membership card and key.

- Members must have their current PDRA membership card while on PDRA property.
- **Members must promptly show** their card to anyone who requests to verify membership status.

RR8. Guests must complete Guest Release / Members responsible for guests.

- 🗐 All guests must:

 - Be accompanied by the member who must provide their name and PDRA card number on the Guest Release form.
 - o **Example 2 Agree to follow all PDRA** Rules and Regulations.
- Members are responsible for guest conduct.
- Guest limits:
 - o Maximum of 10 guests per member at one time.
 - Exception: Once per calendar year more than 10 guests may be allowed only with prior written approval from the Board of Directors. Requests must be sent to info@ncpdra.com at least 2 weeks in advance.
 - o Each guest may visit PDRA property no more than 2 times per calendar year.

RR9. Students must purchase a Training Pass.

- See All students must complete the applicable Student Training Pass and pay the appropriate fee.
- Students are not PDRA members—they are considered guests of their instructor(s).
- Students must provide their instructor with a **copy of the email receipt** confirming their Training Pass purchase.

RR10. Verify status of those on property/No Trespassers.

- JONIY PDRA members and their bona fide guests are permitted on PDRA property.
- \$\mathbb{R}\$ Members must **verify the status** of anyone they encounter on-site.
- If someone is not an authorized guest or member, the member should **politely but firmly ask them to leave** the premises.
- All trespassing incidents must be reported **immediately** to a Quarry Manager, PDRA Board Member, or PDRA Officer.

RR11. No diving or swimming under the influence.

- To ensure the safety of all members and guests, **entering the water while impaired is strictly prohibited**. This includes:
 - P Alcohol
 - o **Prescription drugs** (that impair judgment or coordination)
 - У Any controlled substance
- **i** Zero Tolerance: Violations of this policy may lead to immediate disciplinary action.

RR12. O Jumping or diving from quarry walls is strictly prohibited.

- For your safety and the preservation of PDRA sites, members and guests must **never jump or dive** from quarry walls.
- These areas are not designed or approved for entry into the water, and doing so presents serious risks to life and property.

RR13. Preserve dive features.

- Members and guests must not disturb, remove, alter, or destroy any items placed in PDRA quarries.
- These features are installed to **enhance diving diversity** and learning opportunities for all members.

RR14. • Sishing Prohibited.

- X Fishing is **prohibited** in all **PDRA-owned quarries**. This restriction supports PDRA's **Fish**Management Program (Enacted by Board of Directors on 1/9/2011).
- The **Landowner Protection Act** (i.e., Fishing Rights on Private Land) provides landowners' rights to control access and activities on their property.
- Anyone seen fishing on PDRA property will be reported to the North Carolina Wildlife Resource Commission.

RR15. 🦬 🚫 Hunting Prohibited.

• X Hunting is not allowed under any circumstances on any PDRA-owned property.

RR16. 🔀 🚫 No Spear Guns in PDRA Waters.

- X Spear guns are **not allowed** in any PDRA-owned quarry under normal circumstances.
- Solution Use of spear guns may be permitted only with prior written authorization from the PDRA Board of Directors.

RR17. O Display or discharge of firearms is prohibited.

• A Bringing firearms onto PDRA property is strongly discouraged. Display or discharge of firearms is prohibited.

RR18. No Boats with Motors.

- Permitted Watercraft.
 - A Hand-, paddle-, or oar-propelled boats.
 - Canoes, rafts, tubes, and other similar devices.
- Limited Exception Electric Motors.
 - Electric trolling motors with weed guards are allowed only when no swimmers or divers are in the water.
- 🔊 Diver Propulsion Vehicles.
 - This restriction does not apply to underwater diver propulsion vehicles (DPVs) used for diving activities.

RR19. W Remove Trash.

- 🕹 All Members and guests must **remove their trash** when leaving PDRA property.
- (8) Use on-site trash barrels only when absolutely necessary.
- X Disposing of trash anywhere else on-site is strictly prohibited.

RR20. ## Park only in designated areas.

- Park only in designated areas.
- O Classes and parked vehicles should not interfere with:
 - o **ii** Gates
 - Water entry points
- Follow all signage and verbal instructions issued by:
 - Quarry Managers
 - Board Members
 - PDRA Officers

RR21. / Instruct only in designated areas.

- **Quarry Managers**, guided by the PDRA President, may **designate specific areas** where dive instruction is **permitted or restricted**.
- P Designated instructional areas will be clearly **posted whenever possible**.

RR22. • Gates must remain locked.

- Gates must always remain locked, except during active entry or exit.
- † A member may leave the gate open only if they are physically stationed at the gate.
- During large events (e.g., Annual Treasure Hunt, General Assembly Meeting, quarry workdays), the gate may be left open at the direction of the President and/or Quarry Manager.
- Any problems with locks or keys must be reported immediately to the Quarry Manager.

RR23. 👶 Children must be supervised while on property.

- All children **under 18**—including family members, students, and guests—must be under **continuous adult supervision** while on PDRA property.
- ⊕ Due to the **inherent dangers** of quarry environments (e.g. ♠ drowning, ☑ falls, ♠ rock slides, ☑ snakes), children must **remain with a supervising adult member at all times**.

RR24. Pets and animals of any kind are not allowed on property.

 Pets and all types of animals are strictly prohibited on PDRA property. The PDRA quarries are private property, member-only sites, and not open to the public.

RR25. Si Fireworks are prohibited.

• O For the safety of all members, fireworks are strictly prohibited on PDRA property.

RR26. Quarry locks changed annually on January 1.

- IIII All quarry locks are changed on January 1 each year.
- Members who **renew in time** to receive the upcoming year's key **before January 1** will have uninterrupted access.

- III Due to the inherent risks involved with SCUBA diving, diver/diving insurance is highly recommended for your safety and peace of mind.
- **Dive smart**—protect your adventure before you descend!

RR28. Memorial Wall policy.

- **E** Original Lifetime Members:
 - o Families may request the addition of the name, birth year, and death year of the deceased member.
 - In this will be done at the expense of the PDRA in recognition of their lifetime commitment.
- | All Other Members
 - o Current members or their families may request a memorial nameplate.
 - These additions will be made at the requesting party's expense.
